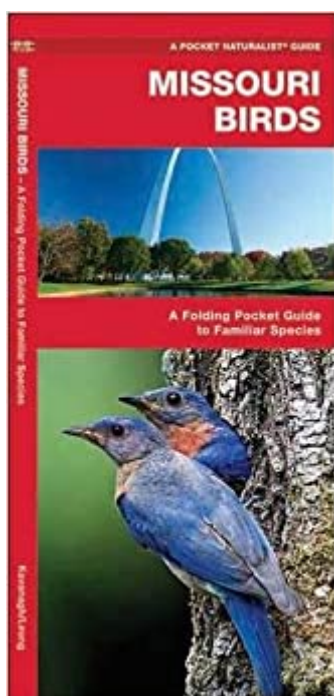

He is also the author of a series of state-specific guides to common species and natural attractions and a children's book on evolution.
