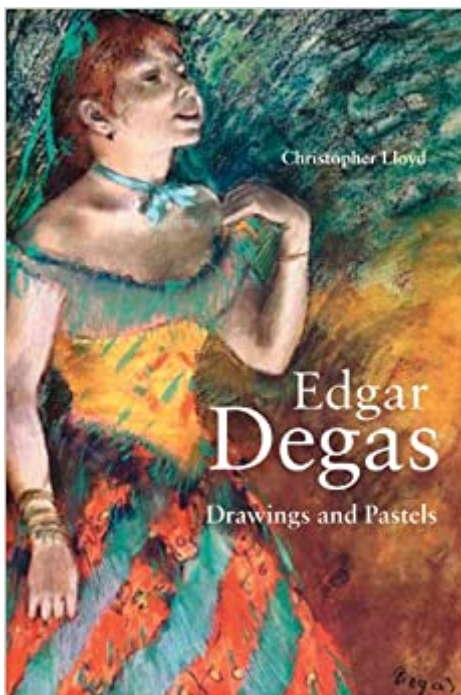


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# Edgar Degas: Drawings And Pastels



## Synopsis

Edgar Degas (1834–1917) was one of the outstanding draftsmen of the nineteenth century, and drawing was not only a central tenet of his art but also essential to his existence. Through an examination of his drawings and pastels, this book reveals the development of Degas's style as well the story of his life, including his complicated relationship with the Impressionists. Following a broadly chronological approach, the author discusses the artist's various subject areas, from the images of dancers—which form over half of Degas's total oeuvre—to nudes, laundresses, milliners, and the less well-known racehorse and landscape drawings. He covers the whole career, from when Degas was copying the Old Masters to learn his craft to when he ceased work in 1912 because of failing eyesight, and sets him within the artistic context of the period. Extensive research, including a careful study of the artist's detailed notebooks, has resulted in a comprehensive exposition with, at its heart, over 200 pencil, black-chalk, pen-and-ink, and charcoal drawings and pastels of timeless appeal.

This is a very important book. Its main role is to show some 230 Drawings and Pastels from throughout Degas's life. The book is of a small format--see the dimensions. The book is copyright Thames and Hudson of London. There is no preface that may explain some of the features, or lack of them-- one is left to guess. Format. There is a few page introduction to each section of drawings and pastels. There are a total of 8 sections. These essays are helpful. They are Not referenced, but there is a brief bibliography at the back which covers a variety of well known books. Not many have Degas drawings or pastels as their primary focus. After the essay there is a good selection of drawings and pastels in each section -- this is the great achievement of this book. These are drawn from a number of major institutions and private collections. Reproductions. The reproductions are in full colour and excellent. They are on the small side but are very well done. They may be one per page or occasionally one per two pages. Little information is given-- Title, Date, Media, dimensions and Owner. The drawings and pastels are left to stand by themselves. Other than the commentary in the essay section there is no individual comment on the drawings and pastels. Catalogue Raisonné-- why was there no commentary. You may want to, or not want to read this section. I am not sure why there is no commentary-- I am not sure if there is a Catalogue Raisonné ( CR --academic catalogue ) of Degas Drawings and Degas Pastels exist. If it does exist then the author should have referenced each item by CR number. If a CR exists he should have made more comment on the items in the book. If there is no CR then it is a lot of hard work for the scholar to collect all the necessary information to write his comments. He has to do this for each item. My guess is that there is no CR but someone may well correct me. NOTE Jean S Boggs a noted Canadian Degas scholar was working on a Catalogue Raisonné when she died in 2000. Other scholars were working with her on the project. I am unsure where this project is at present. These catalogues usually reflect many years of work. ( see The National Gallery of Canada website under Jean Sutherland Boggs Fonds ( I presume Fonds to mean Sources. It gives a brief biography of Jean S Boggs and then notes her material archived at the National Gallery of Canada. This mainly has to do with Degas Drawings.

)There are a French multivolume work on Degas-- My French is not good enough to tell if these include his Drawings and Pastels or not. Paul-Andre Lemoisne. " Degas et son Oeuvre " 4 volumes. 1946 --issued in 980 copies. In Ursus Books catalogue 232 it is POR Price on Request -- ie very very expensive. There is a reprint in 1984 with a fifth supplementary volume cost \$ 2,500. My guess is that either this Catalogue Raisonne did not cover Pastels and or Drawings or the Author did not have ready and frequent access to it. Summary This is a great book on Degas Drawings and Pastels. My love is Master Drawings and I have several books on Degas Drawings. This is probably the best. There are 230 drawings and Pastels that are reproduced in excellent colour. The drawings and Pastels are arranged in a basic chronological order so you can try and discover how his style developed. There a number of studies of Dancers, some of Nudes, Bathers, Laundress's, Milliners, Racehorses and Landscapes. The author briefly introduces each section.
