Faber's method is a well-rounded and well-organized series that strives to help a student develop musicianship, technique (especially commendable for its technique books), knowledge of theory, sight reading (a crucial skill which is often neglected in preference to playing entirely by ear or memory), some transposition, and creative instincts (though improvisation may need to be supplemented). This primer is for young beginners with no reading experience, building on pre-staff notation to introduce early on rhythm and directional reading while building fingers. The staff is used by the end of this book.

I highly recommend this set of books. I am learning to play piano pretty much on my own. I took one lesson just to get me started and have the option to go again on an as needed basis and other than that I am using these books. You can read the review I just posted for the primer level sight reading

book by Faber for more information but I think these books are great. I purchased the primer level and level 1 which I will I have heard will take 8-12 months to get to level 1 but that is fine. I live a long way from piano lessons and these books once I had a starting point seem to be getting me along just great in the learning to play piano. I think it best to get the complete set along with the Christmas music and sight reading books. The Christmas book gives you something to boost your confidence as you can hear a song and recognize it and you are playing it, the sight reading is something you can read through at night and this 4 book set offers a base of additional information that I think builds a firmer learning foundation for playing the piano. I have no musical background whatsoever - all I knew was to dust the one I had and I love these books. I had one lesson and have since used only these books - I am 2 weeks into learning and I recognize quite a bit although I am trying to get my brain to make my fingers move a bit quicker but the connection of what fingers to move is not to fast yet! LOL Left hand really throws me but getting better.

I use this series for all of my private piano students. It is fun and engaging for all Elementary grades. It is easy to follow and the technique and artistry book is great for students who need extra practice or want a little more to get ahead

We are a homeschooling family and add piano as a subject. This set of books tells you clearly which pages should be grouped together as a lesson. Just simply follow the guide at the bottom of the pages. Even your own child can read the bottom of the page and know what pages in each book they should complete for their lesson. This book is allowing my 8 year old to teach himself piano without a piano teacher. Although he has parents that can read music and know how to play piano he can complete the weeks lessons himself, daily, and we are able to do a "lesson" / check of progress every few days with him (or once a week) as an actual piano teacher would. If you are an adult trying to learn piano I see nothing wrong with using this set. Do not rush through it just because it is easy. take the time for your hands to really know the keys before moving on to reading music!! If you or your children fly through it they will not actually learn where the keys are and then they will feel frustrated when you move up a level!

These particular set of piano lesson books were recommended by my son's piano teacher. Like many other things I worry where I would find things on island. I'm a prime member so more often times than not I order through . These books were not expensive like I thought they would be and came in a set. Love it and gets a lot of use.

In my opinion, this spends a bit too much time on finger numbering. I typically skip many parts of the beginning and really dive in with the musical alphabet. Other than that, this set has been great for my students!

I love using the Faber method for teaching piano lessons because they are sequenced nicely. The Primer Level does a good job of helping the student to learn notes on the piano and playing songs (with limited notation) before being introduced to the staff. Once they are introduced to the staff, they are already familiar with proper hand position, proper playing technique, and melodic sequences. My students have always had great success with these books, and I plan to continue using them in the future.

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
