

The Walk West is an exciting adventure that begins in swampy, sweaty Louisiana and concludes on the cool shores of Oregon. Peter Jenkins' wife and walking partner, Barbara, is a strong writer and I sometimes enjoyed her descriptions more than his. She is billed as co-author of The Walk West but only wrote about 20 percent of the story. Her sensitive contributions balance out her husband's often rough details and gruff dialogue. I feel this book could have been about 100 pages shorter. By the time they got to Idaho, I skipped ahead to the end. Overall, though, I was riveted in many places and felt sad whenever Peter mentioned his beloved dog, Cooper, who was his best buddy in A Walk Across America. If you want to revisit a simpler time (1976 to 1979) read this book for the nostalgia and the Americana.

I kept hearing about how you just had to read this book so I finally did. I enjoyed it okay. I got a little tired of his highly dramatic writing. Some incidences just didn't ring true for me--seemed like fiction. I don't think it is a hiking must read as a lot of people claim.
