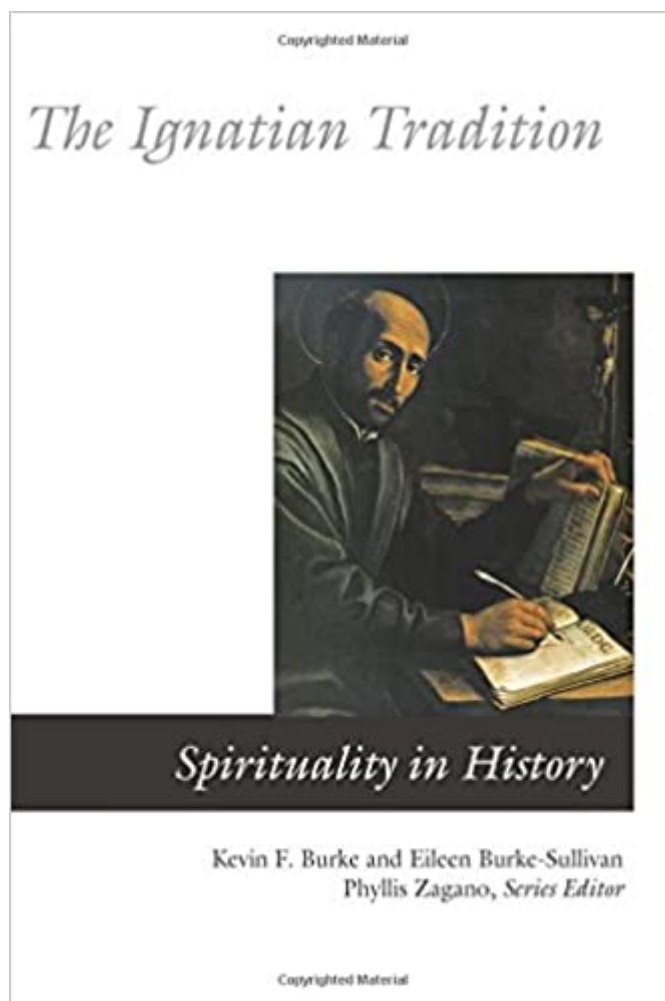

Synopsis

The Ignatian tradition sprang up in the sixteenth century, the fruit of graces bestowed on a Basque nobleman, Ignatius of Loyola. Guided by a passion to find God in all things, Ignatius and his first companions founded the Society of Jesus and inspired many other religious orders and lay movements. Their influence spread across the globe even as they embraced various aspects of the cultures, languages, and institutions they encountered. This introduction is a mere sampling of the men and women influenced by Ignatius 'draws on the stories and writings of nineteen exemplary individuals as well as the corporate voice of the Jesuit order. Here we meet missionaries, scholars, artists, advocates, and martyrs. Contemplatives in action, they follow Christ by serving others. They embody the freedom born of a passionate knowledge of God's unending, unconditional love; precisely in this, they show us how to live well today. If you are looking to see how Ignatian Spirituality has been influential throughout the past few centuries, this is the book for you. It highlights individuals, both men and women, who have been

influenced by St. Ignatius and how they have applied in their own lives, both in the religious and secular life (to include culture). I read the book for a class, but it was helpful to see how St. Ignatius has shaped a part of the history of Christianity.

The section on the Jesuit, Fr. Alfred Delp, SJ, killed by the Nazi's in the last months of WW II is priceless, worth the book alone for that section. The other sections are enormously valuable. The section on Fr. Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, S.J. is priceless, as well as the introduction by Kevin Burke on Teilhard's life.

Much of the spiritual foundation that we take for granted in our Catholic faith has been formed by great saints, such as St. Ignatius. It is always beneficial to revisit our roots and learn more about those who helped pave the way.
