I have always been fan of fantasy novels, movies, and even videogames. However, after a bit of examination, I have discovered that our Santa from this novel has nothing to do with the bearded old man that likes to jump through chimneys and fill our socks with all kinds of goodies. Santa Claus is the king of elves and as such, he is always on a quest (of defending his realm from never-ending invaders in form of ghouls, goblins, and even dragons). This is excellent, especially if you are a fantasy-novel fan, like me. However, a lot more is needed if someone wants to write a quality story with fantasy elements. For instance, the story needs to be able to attract its readers. It needs to be easy and immersive and I have to say that Mr. B. C. Chase did an excellent job here. Too bad the novel does not have at least two hundred pages more. My opinion is that a fantasy novel with less than three hundred pages cannot comprehend everything the author maybe wanted to show us when he introduced us into his fantasy world. Overall, I like this novel a lot, but since it is too short, I will give it 4 out of 5.

If you love Christmas and Lord of the Rings / The Hobbit then you will very much enjoy this tale. It is almost fan fiction when you compare the two but enjoyable none the less.
