

However, at my daughters insistence I purchased the book and am so glad I did. It is very informative and if you are working on a project, as I was at the time, and don't understand what the directions mean, just look the subject up in the index and you get meanings and or step-by-step instructions. A must have for beginners as well as those who have been sewing for a long time.

The book has helped me greatly already. I refer to it often, and like to see the visuals that are provided for some actual projects. It has helped me make a lot of people happy by receiving as gifts some of what I have learned to sew. I would recommend the book to any beginner.

If you are a true beginner this book is not for you. The layout is terrible, the book mentions industry

standards and technical terms long before it covers them. It jumps around a lot, more than any dummies book I've seen before and I have a soft spot for the series. The explanations are unclear and the pictures and diagrams are not very helpful. However if you're an intermediate seamstress or seamster and are already semi familiar with the subject this book still holds a lot of useful information.

I hadn't sewn for many years. I bought this book, hoping it would guide me and IT DID!!Very comprehensive, lots of tips and solid information and pretty easy to follow. I recommend it.

I do not consider myself a "dummy" but I have never done any real sewing until the past 7-8 months. I decided to take something new up to keep myself active after I retired, and sewing (more specifically, quilting) piqued my interest. The book explained a lot of concepts, which after some experimentation, I could understand and do reasonably well.

WARNING: When she says "Sewing For Dummies," she MEANS it! She is very thorough in her teaching and her examples and, as a beginner seamstress, I probably really really could use and need all of the information that she offers. She really intends for you to use this book as a reference point in all of your sewing projects. However, if you're super excited and just want to get your hands dirty with your first project, you can skip maybe the first 4 chapters and get to the nitty-gritty. Since I know virtually nothing about sewing, I read through the first 4 and it kinda dampened my excitement a little. So, my advice: jump around and read about what you're excited about first and then go back. It sounds convoluted but, don't worry! She pretty much references EVERYTHING!

Although I learned to sew in a home ec class in High School, I'd forgotten a lot in 40+/years later. This book takes me back. There isn't a question that went unanswered in this book. I highly recommend it for sewers of all types!

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
