

John W. Kiser is the author of four books including The Monks of Tibhirine: Faith, Love, and Terror in Algeria (St. Martins, 2002). He is a former international technology broker with a B.A. in European History from Columbia and an M.B.A. from the University of Chicago. His articles have been published in Foreign Policy Magazine, the Washington Post.

This is a very well researched biography of Emir Abd el-Kader, the first leader to resist French colonization of Algeria. In many ways, this is an important work in the polarized world we live in today and Kiser's awareness of this diplomatic aspect of his penmanship is evident throughout the book. Indeed this higher motivation, of bridging the current religious and civilizational divide, is at times a bit of a distraction in the engaging historic narrative that we find unfolding in the pages of this book. Abd el-Kader was raised in the tolerant religious tradition of Islamic Sufism, and his duties and obligations as a religious scholar and leader were paramount during his military campaigns and later on during his exile in France and ultimately in Damascus. A clear distinction is visible between Abd el-Kader's worldview and that of the stereotypical Islamic scholar of today. Kiser treats his subject with respect - respect that often borders on adulation, but the treatment of the French is also gentle. Despite being colonizers (some contemplating the Native American solution to Algeria), many of them are depicted as wanting to do the right thing. Definitely worth reading.

This traces the outward actions of this man but shies away from integrating his spiritual beliefs into his person; a move that does not help the reader fully understand the motivations for most of his actions. This could have been much more. Still waiting for a biography on this man that satisfies...

Kiser aptly summarizes the great philosopher-warriors life. He offers readers a window onto the life of one of Islam's great luminaries and defenders, Emir Abdelkader, who famously fought the French with honour and restraint, and later saved thousands of Christians in Damascus from a Muslim mob.

A very interesting and inspiring book centered on a 19th century Muslim leader who became a hero to Christians, including Abraham Lincoln.

A moving story told in lucid prose. It's one weakness was in not capturing more of the Emir's spiritual life as a Sufi. A similar book, Embattled Saints tells the tale of an Afghan Sufi who fought the Soviets that richly describes the profound spiritual teaching and methods behind these remarkable men.
