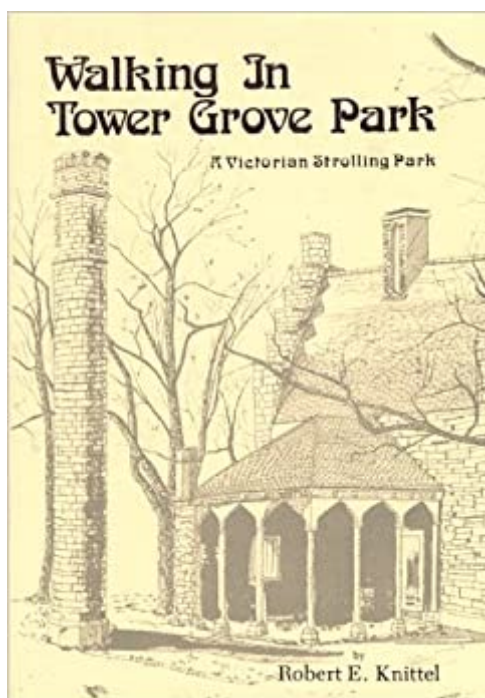

Walking In Tower Grove Park: A Victorian Strolling Park



Synopsis

The author and his dog, "Herb," take you on a tour through the seasons of the year and a century of time in this unique Victorian strolling park. It is one of the country's greatest treasures. Recently it was designated a National Historic Landmark. St. Louis is one of three cities in the U.S. to have that historical distinction. Only three other parks in the United States have landmark status: Central Park in New York City; Boston Commons, and Boston Public Garden. The author brings the park alive through five seasons of the year, Early Spring, Late Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter, melding his observations of life in the park with those on life itself. For Spring to be fully appreciated it must be seen in perspective with the other seasons of the year. In *Walking In Tower Grove Park* Robert Knittel takes you through them all, from peeping buds through trembling leaves, to colorful boughs, and finally crisp, dead foliage beneath your feet. A one minute walk in the park. Imagine a quiet bit of England set down in the midwest United States. Imagine it as a quiet strolling park, landscaped in the "gardenesque" style, with frilly, carved gazebos popping up all about and lovely avenues of trees, secluded glens and rivulets, opening up into a formal pond complete with romantic ruins, a scene worthy of the wealthiest nobleman's estate. Near the reflecting pond, a steeped Victorian band stand shelters a group of seasoned musicians tuning up to play classical and popular favorites. You hear another musical sound, the tinkling splash of water from a fountain blended into the summer chanting of the cicadas, as you lie on the grass enjoying nature's concert, waiting for the musicians to begin. Such a dream comes true in Tower Grove Park in St. Louis, where the author takes you by the hand on his daily rounds with his dog, "Herb," describing minutely each change of leaf and bud, each flower and tree, as he walks through the seasons of the year, through a century of time, in this unique, unusual example of a Victorian strolling park. Although you will be sure to yearn to join that time-lost land, you will not have to travel there to enjoy it. For, in these pages, you may walk with the author in a special place, a land and time apart, that still exists today.

I've never been to Tower Grove Park in St. Louis, though after reading this book I feel I know it well. Robert Knittel reminds his readers of the joys and rewards of walking for pleasure, stopping to observe and breathe in details, taking detours recommended by a curious canine guide (the author's airdale Herb believes in taking the trails less traveled). In this fast-paced world, we need guides like this, which encourage us not to squeeze all the top sites into one frantic touring afternoon, but to savor and discover our most familiar surroundings through the seasons.

While this book is about 20 years old it tells a good story about Tower Grove Park. This park is one of only four in the United States designated as a national historical park. At the present time the park is being restored and new trees being added. With this, new walks are being established and will be

known as the Discovery Forest. The Discovery Forest is being dedicated on 16 April 1999 and Mr.Knittel has been invited to participate.
