If you're headed to Shanghai and you love local eateries and authentic street food, you have two choices: 1. Cobble together a list from a variety of websites and online forums, hoping it includes the necessary street addresses, Chinese characters, and other up-to-date info you'll need to actually make it useful once you're on the ground. 2. Spend a few bucks, save yourself a ton of time, and buy *Glutton Guide Shanghai*. Jamie and Kyle have done all the footwork. They've spent years exploring every corner of Shanghai and designing tours that take visitors to Shanghai to the places you'll want to check out. I'll admit it, I'm a bit biased because I spent a few years eating my way through Shanghai, and I even led a few of the tours they designed. I don't live in Shanghai anymore, so I got the *Glutton Guide* to make sure I have all the most recent information when I do head back and gorge myself on soup dumplings and crawfish. It's also a serious nostalgia trip for me. These are things that most expats won't know about unless they've sought them out, and many locals won't bother mentioning to visitors. The guide has the name of practically every little longtang alleyway I ever wandered down, all the random markets I was surprised to find, and best of all it's got the ones I still haven't had a chance to check out yet.

Without this guide book, or a guide (the writer's of the book also run a food tasting tour company in Shanghai) - I would have missed out on so many of the wonderful food options China has to offer. Instead of just pointing to a menu and hoping for the best, I could use this guide to sample must-try dishes and new eats I'd never even known existed. This isn't just a Lonely Planet type-book to tell

you what you should 'try when you're in China', it's a guidebook that cultivates unique and delicious adventures. Not to mention, they promise to update it frequently so that you don't miss out on all the new foodie frenzies...or wind up to a formerly mouthwatering mecca, only to find the gates have shut. Move away from the McDonald's safety net and see what you can discover on your own!
