

The monument, however, is a different story, and Allen captures it in this thoroughly illustrated book, published to coincide with the reopening of the monument in early July after a two-year renovation. It will also coincide with a TV special on the Discovery Channel. Allen provides

a brief biographical sketch of Washington; a chronology of the construction of the monument, which took almost 100 years; and background on events centering on and around the monument, Pierre Charles L'Enfant's plans for the city, and the evolution of the monument itself.
