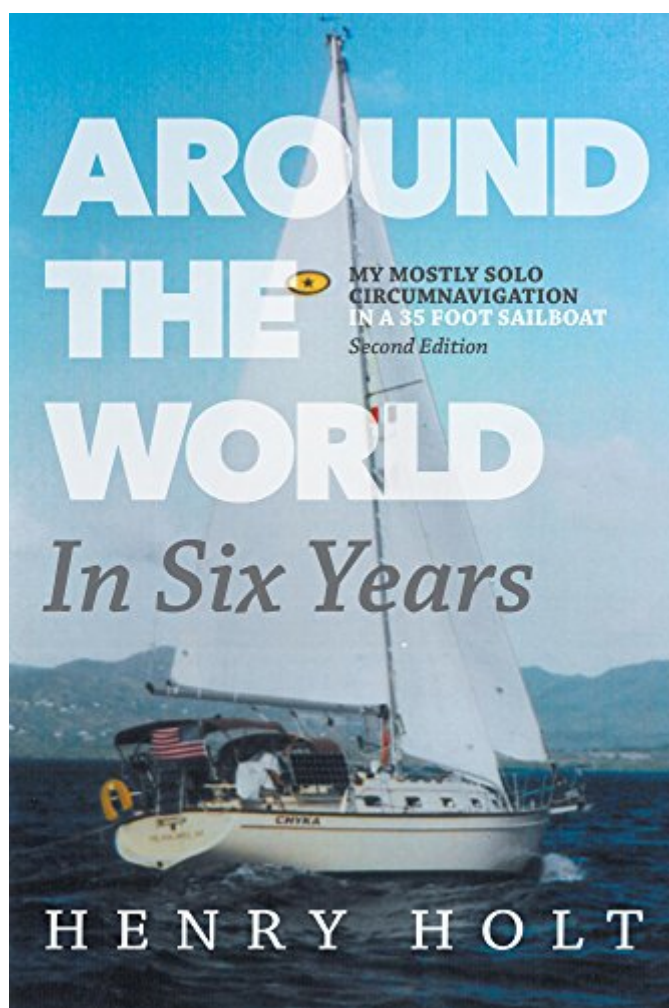

All the details are there. His description of his transit of "pirate alley" is fascinating and the trip up the Red Sea and through the Suez was unique. By the end of the story, I was sorry to bid adieu to Henry Holt. The Appendix with tips for voyagers is useful. Missing are colorful descriptions non-engineers provide. Missing from those colorful stories are the technical matters Henry Holt provides. It would be terrific

This book doesn't bog you down in minutia it gives an account of his travels without telling you what he ate for each meal. It is well written and gives the reader a sense of the experience. Both the things that are enjoyable about cruising and the things that could have gone extremely wrong. If you want a book that will help you understand the day to day life of a cruiser this book will be right for you.

This is not the typical circumnavigation account by any stretch of the imagination. Mr. Holt was able to solve any problem by throwing money at it. That made for a rather boring account of an oft-interrupted cruise.

Reads like a bad diary, I would recommend only as a last resort to insomnia. I love reading about cruising adventures, but this was a jumbled, boring ships diary that somehow got published. Terrible
