

My knowledge of Greek history is self-taught, so I enjoy occasionally reading well-written books for younger readers, in order to fill in gaps. Mills' book was published in 1925 for high school students and is very nicely written, so it really would be a solid book even for present-day adults - except for a few "missing" things. It is a little startling to read that Oedipus killed his father and became King - but to find no mention of that other infamous thing he did. It would be a great book for home-schooling if you don't want to have to deal with uncomfortable topics while studying Greek

history. I would have liked to have read it when I was in high school, and I enjoyed it now.

I have a near mint copy of (20th edition) of the original 1926 version. Regardless of the date of this book, it is still an excellent book; rich with information, maps and charts. The book provides an awesome survey in one volume; it covers the entire span of ancient greek civilization from the minoans to the conquest of greece by Rome. Plus, she is able to cover an incredible amount of material: the wars, the arts, philosophy etc. Her writing style is excellent, I started reading her works as a teenager and still find them excellent as an adult. If you come across any of her books in a used book store or garage sale etc, grab it!
