

The book shares little-known facts that explain the survival of horses in difficult environments; e.g., the purpose of the thick hairs that grow along the upper lips of Kazakh horses is to sift sand from the grass before they eat it, and the double coats of Exmoor ponies help them survive harsh winters. The photographs are what make this book. The text lists breeds and describes their characteristics. But the photographs are sensational. The horses are photographed more as art than illustration. Gorgeous views of heads, eyes, muscles, movement.
