

If you get the Kindle version, read this. First, content-wise, this was a great book. From start to finish. Fields does a good job of putting youth ministry back into the category of Christian ministry. While he deals very specifically with the facets of youth ministry, his broader-picture perspective is much needed. But if you get the Kindle version, be warned:- this was probably scanned and never kindle-edited. There are a lot of missing spaces between comma and word. And occasionally there are entire words missing.- there are no page numbers. Not a big deal, but when I read a Kindle, I like it to feel like a book.- no X-Ray. I don't use this feature, but if you do (fyi). It's still readable on Kindle, but if I knew this, I'd have gone with the paperback.

This is not a "how to" guide directing you what to do or how to lead your group. It is a book that discusses the pitfalls and dangers of leading, and how you as a youth leader can avoid those traps. This book has given me a tremendous amount of confidence as a youth director. I've been working in youth ministry for 4 years, and I wish I'd read this earlier. It is extremely helpful! Highly recommended. This isn't for just youth pastors, or people who are interested in ministry. It is extremely helpful even for people who just want volunteer once a week. Great book! Very practical and applicable!

I was hired part time by my church 8 months ago to be the student minister. I had been a volunteer for a few years in a ministry that had no official youth pastor. With two degrees in music performance, I said yes to the church because they saw my interaction with the youth and I saw a need and enjoyed interacting with the teenagers. Thank you for this book. I'm very impressed at how thoroughly this book covers youth ministry and how a Youth Director can really shape, structure, and lead their ministry in a smart and effective way, while still maintaining good working relationships with the entire church staff, youth volunteers, and youth families. It has great applications. I am really happy to have gotten it my first year in ministry leadership, but have even seen crossover into other areas of my life as a manager and team member. Highly

I will refer back to this book over and over throughout the years. I may get a hard copy, however. The kindle edition was difficult to follow. I imagine the hard copy of this book has small blocks with quotes from various youth ministers scattered throughout the pages, but in digital form there are no blocks, meaning that you see quotes stuck in the middle of paragraphs for no apparent reason or indication that the speaker has changed.

I have been a full-time youth and young adult pastor for over four years now and I found much of what Doug had to say to be very accurate and insightful. It may not be very deep theologically, the jokes may be a little silly, and the grammar may be occasionally poor, but those are just minor complaints in comparison to an overall very enjoyable read. I recommend this book to any person planning on becoming a youthworker and definitely to any youth pastor who feels a bit discouraged or burned out. The purpose of the book is not to give you a step by step guideline as to how to run a youth ministry (that is found in Doug's other well-known book "The Purpose Driven Youth Ministry"), but instead its focus is on the spiritual health of the youthworker. The demands of serving in youth ministry are many and Doug does a tremendous job at giving practical advice to help any youth worker thrive. I am teaching a "Youth Ministry" class at CCBC this semester and I plan on using this book as our required textbook.

I am not a youth director but this book has it all. Very easy to understand and practical tips you could read and implement. No theological background required. I purchased these and gave them out at our denominational youth adult conference. They loved them. As a pastor I feel that the contents of this book could and will also help new pastors, just replace youth with congregation and you are up and running.

Doug Fields' Your First Two Years in Youth Ministry was an interesting read. It was pretty enlightening in the field of youth ministry overall. I had to read it for a college class, and I expected it to be a shallow, uninteresting read. I was very wrong. Fields has a lot of great advice to offer those wanting to get into youth ministry (or those already involved but looking for advice) thanks to his many years or service in youth ministry.
