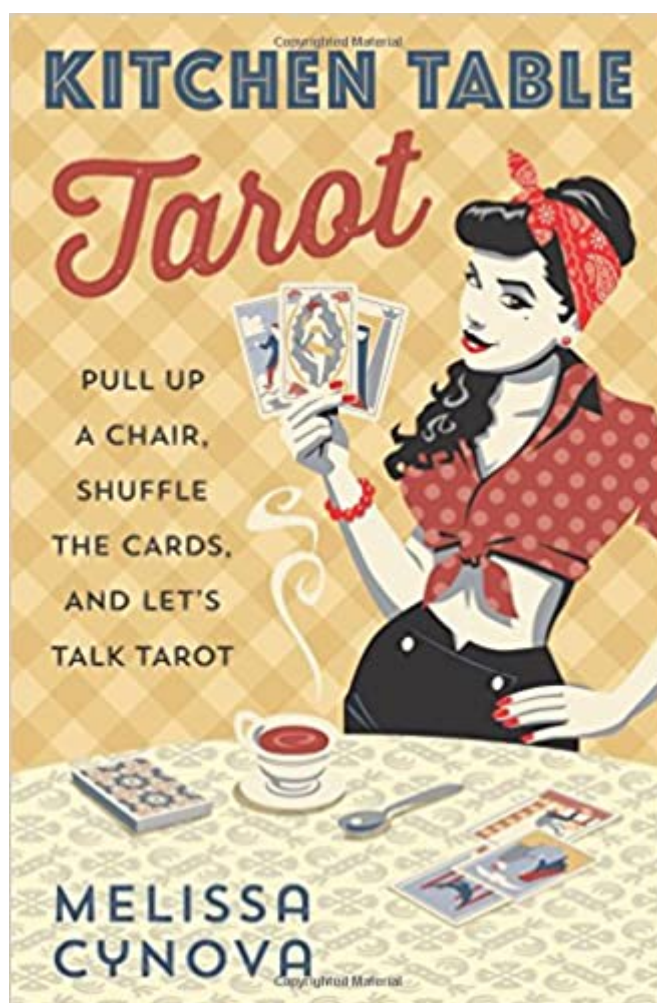

I use this book every single day. For many years, my go to had been Nancy Garen's "Tarot Made Easy," but this now sits on my desk. I love the author's easy conversational style and the other books and sites she recommends if you want to search deeper. This book is the one that reignited my love of Tarot.

I've been a student of tarot off and on for 20 years, and I swear this is the best book out there for getting a handle on the meanings. Many books can be more esoteric, which can be hard for a beginner. Her meanings really help the aspiring reader to see how to apply the meaning to real life. Super straight forward, it's like you're having a conversation where someone is explaining what a card means in everyday language, instead of writing something that sounds deep and pretty (something a lot of deck companion books do). I will be using this book to teach with. That said, if you want something going over the kabbala, numerology and alchemy aspects of cards, this is not the book for that. This is just a straight forward, no nonsense guide to reading.

This book changed my life as a Tarot Card Reader. And I mean that. Changed. My. Life.

I'm so glad I stumbled across this book. I picked it up when I decided on a whim to teach myself Tarot because I know nothing about it. This book has made the learning curve so much more

enjoyable. Tarot is essentially storytelling, and I love that the explanations in this book are given in a funny, engaging way, using everyday expressions and analogies to help me decipher the symbolism and remember what they mean. I really feel like I'm sitting down at the kitchen table with the author over a cup of coffee or a glass of wine, and we are laughing our butts off as she teaches me.

I love the tone of this book. You really do feel like you're sitting at the kitchen table with a person who has seen it all and wants to share what works and what doesn't with everyone she can. I'm new to tarot, so I can't tell if there is anything here that would be earth-shattering to someone who's been doing this a while. But I can tell you that she presents some of same information I've seen elsewhere *in a way that makes sense to me.* There are a few things that seem to always be described the same way, and she brings them down to earth and gives me a mental image that sticks in my brain. Not that any other tarot book I've read or reviewed hasn't been worthwhile, because I've been fortunate enough to read amazing works. But, in this area, Ms. Cynova does something extraordinary, and I am grateful. If you're hurting your head against concepts again and again in other books, you might want to give this one a try. If nothing else, she's entertaining as heck, too!
