

Many books relating to teaching give lofty ideals and not too much you can actually apply. This book, for the most part, has awesome information, soundly based in theories proven though sound research. It gives you advice that you can actually use in your classroom to both set up your room to prevent problems from occurring as well as advice about how to address less favorable behaviors in an effective manner. This book has great advice whether you are teaching pre-K or high-school, life skills or gifted and talended, as well as every classroom in between. It does give a background on many SPED concepts, but this is not the main focus the book.

The book arrived pretty worn out but for a rental, I wasn't expecting a new book. I only rented this book because of a class I was taking so I did not read the entire thing. I read only assigned chapters which were pretty interesting and did give a lot of good examples to explain the different support systems for student behavior. Overall, for the purpose of the class, it was a good book.

I'm not a fan of this textbook. It's physically annoying because of the loose-leaf pages, which rip easily. My biggest problem with this textbook is that you do not have complete access to the content unless you use/purchase the access card. Going through the textbook there are many places that tell you to look at or view a toolbox or demonstration, which is only accessible by using the code. I found this to be a real drawback of using this textbook. If I'm using a textbook I want access to all of the content at once without needing to purchase a special short-term code to view the rest of the information. I've been using this textbook for most of the semester now, so I'm writing this after having already read many chapters in the book.
