Most parents either blindly trust the internet or blindly fear it. In the early days of the internet when my children were young and there weren't as many dangers lurking on the web as there are today I used to belong to the second group. As we all got used to the internet being a normal part of our everyday life I gradually and without really being aware of it learned to ignore many of the possible dangers. When I read about viruses, phishing, fake articles or even sexual harassment on social media I would casually mention it to my kids and usually get an answer like: "Come on dad, we're not stupid. we know more about these things than you do". I didn't know what else to say. Many times I wished someone who knew more about computer and internet safety than I would explain these things to them in a way they could relate to and in "their own language". That's exactly what Charles Conway does in his much-needed book. In his collection of short stories he succeeds where I failed, making children aware of the importance of computer and internet safety without sounding like an old-fashioned teacher but as a "by-product" of some great and easy to read thrillerlike short stories. They'll become computer savvy without even noticing it. What a great idea! I think that all parents should have their kids read and re-read this book, read it themselves and talk about it. That could prevent a lot of misery and will prepare them for a world where hackers and cyber-criminals create new threats on the internet every day. Great book, highly recommended!

While they are reading this book your kids won't even realize that they are learning. The author manages to do a great job of getting into character and it's hard not to believe that the stories aren't being told by teenagers. Each story takes on a single internet safety problem like playing MMORPG games, keeping personal info private, cyber bullying and meeting new people online. Every story has a moment when you realize what the character did wrong and if you read it with your kids it's easy to get into a conversation about what they should have done differently. My kids are hoping that there will be a sequel so they can see what happens to Steve and Lucy next, even my son who hardly ever reads anything. If I had to criticize something it would be that Lucy talks really fast and that can leave the reader a bit breathless if reading out loud, but it doesn't take away anything from the enjoyment.
