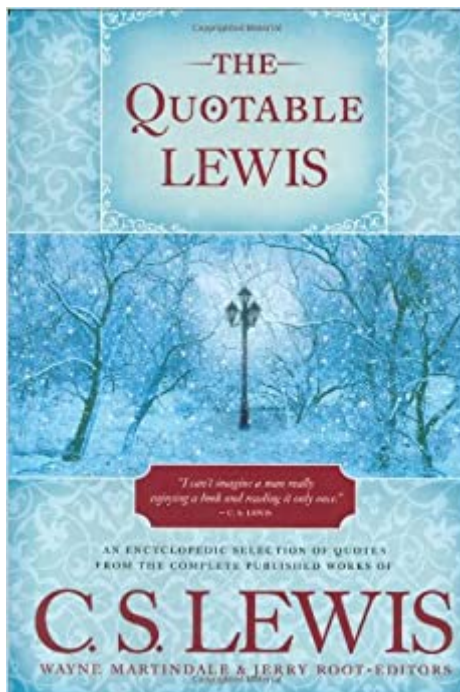

WAYNE MARTINDALE has a Ph.D. in English from the University of California, Riverside, and is associate professor of English at Wheaton College, where he uses Lewis's works in many of his courses. JERRY ROOT has an M.Div. from Talbot Theological Seminary and is senior pastor of Trinity Baptist Church in Santa Barbara, California. He formerly taught philosophy and religion at College of DuPage in northern Illinois, where he made extensive use of Lewis's work. He has avidly studied and collected Lewis's works for many years.

Why does his writing remain so popular? As an Oxford scholar, Christian apologist, and author of the Chronicles of Narnia, C. S. Lewis wrote prolifically in many genres, covering a wide spectrum of topics. His soaring imagination is anchored in a unifying concept of who God is, who we are as God's fallen creatures, the destiny of humankind, and the need for redemption and perfection in Christ. There is nothing in literature which does not, in some degree, percolate into life. - C. S. Lewis, "The Allegory of Love"

Not only is this book an excellent resource for Christian speakers/preachers/etc., but it can also be of usefulness an individual's personal life by offering words on joy, peace, death, etc. The quotes are topically organized, and the references back to the original works are very helpful when you can't quite remember exactly which book contains that C.S. Lewis quote that has been running through your mind lately. This book is also helpful if you engage in theological conversations and/or debates. The quotes included in the book are good encapsulations of the gyst of many of Lewis' insights into human nature, Divine nature, and Divine human nature. Some sections that I have found especially helpful in informal philosophical debates are "Free Will", "Sin", "Human Nature", and "Love." Any diehard Lewis fan (without a photographic memory), who loves being able to quote him in sermons, academic papers or in conversation, could greatly benefit from having this book.

I purchased this book specifically for reference work for a manuscript I hope to actually work on one day. The book came undamaged and in excellent condition. The book is rather thick and bulky but it is an exhaustive reference of the best quotes from the master of literature himself, C.S. Lewis. I find myself looking something up for reference but becoming mesmerized by the poetic and artistic prose of this great writer. I will spend hours just reading through this masterpiece and find myself sharing the tidbits of wisdom with others who my have the unfortunate luck of being in the same room with me. This collection is compiled by Wayne Martindale and Jerry Root. They have done an excellent job and have gone to great lengths to find the best quotes of C.S. Lewis including footnotes and cross references. This will be a wonderful addition to any home or school library.

As other reviewers have noted, everything Lewis wrote is amazing. The profundity of his thought and the simplicity of his presentation are two of the characteristics which mark him as a literary master. This book then gathers gems from Lewis' corpus, they are grouped topically, and indexed. Thankfully there are also references made to the source from which any given quote was taken, so that future reading is made easier to find. This is certainly a good reference book to have for reflection, inspiration or instruction.

This title is for BOTH the general reader and for the scholar of Lewis. Handy and easy to use. Both of the editors care and teach about their subject and have published other titles you might enjoy; but this is the "go-to" volume for quick reference and for perusal as well.
